First Presbyterian Church in Dallas will be having a Family Mission Trip to our area June 23rd-26th. This is their first time and it has been so great working with them as they planned their daily routines. They will arrive early in the morning on Thursday and assist with unloading the delivery truck from North Texas Food Bank. They will assist at the GCS warehouse for Children's Express and

Grand Central Station, and will help unload food at the Green House. We hope they will have time for a swim at AC after a hard day's work. This will occupy that first day and provide some excellent assistance for all three groups. Friday they will volunteer at the Green House with some long needed repairs to make the house more accessible to those needing their service. They will also assist with inside work that is needed. After a picnic lunch at Old



Settler's Park they will spend the afternoon at the Crisis Center and share a cookout with the folks there. Saturday the group will assist with preparation of brown-bag lunches, handing them out, and if needed additional work at GCS and/or warehouse. They will take lunches from GCS and have picnic at Old Settler's again. The afternoon will be spent viewing the Dino Days exhibit at The Sherman Museum before heading back to Wolf Run Ranch where they are staying for the length of the trip. They will have an

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#### Service Academy for Youth (SAY) A Project of Grand Central Station's Great Days of Service

SAY exists to teach the value of service to teens and pre-teens in a camp setting. Combining fun and hard work, SAY was started some 15 years ago to emphasize the importance of helping our neighbors in need. Because of the generosity of the Oliver Dewey Mayor Foundation, there is no charge for students to attend, thus allowing a diverse mix of individuals to experience this unique program and the opportunity for growth.

Austin College has been the residential setting each year for 150 local teens to spend 4 summer days together, working on community projects, learning from adult and peer role models, and getting to know and understand one another. The City of Sherman each year identifies project homes, yards, and public areas that are in need of major and minor tender loving care and our kids go to work. Tasks include sanding, painting, building, mowing, weed pulling and numbering curbs for 911 identification.

During the week, a motivational speaker inspires participants with personal stories and leadership cues. The purpose of these sessions is to introduce students from varied backgrounds to outlooks that might generate new thoughts and moral paths. Fun and festive activities provide respite from the Texas sun and enable social and teamwork skill development. Activities include Cookouts, Bubble Soccer, Park Volleyball, Field Day events, Rough Rider Baseball games, Snow Cone outings, and Wheelchair Basketball. Pre-teens attend in a Day Camp setting at various local churches and develop service projects for local groups and individuals. Each year they visit retirement centers bearing gifts and with offers of songs and entertainment.

SAY recruits former participants to serve as volunteer counselors for the program each year. Counselors enjoy the opportunity to give back for their own time in the program, mentor young people, teach the value of service, and continue to develop their own leaderships skills. Local businesses and churches donate their time, transportation, and product to support the program each year. *SAY Rocks!*
